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## Who is benefiting from Plan B's service?

Who benefits from Plan B? It is a question we pose daily. We can measure the tangible benefits to our students every day through their positive, consistent attendance. We record their progression through the engagement we see and the work they produce. Hard evidence is then recorded through our reporting of results against student targets, such as those documented in their Education and Healthcare Plan outcomes. We enjoy working with students and seeing them thrive in the vocational education environment. This is why we work as hard as we do - not only to help achieve better outcomes for our students, but also for their families, to help create a more cohesive and pleasant community and ultimately a more progressive and positive society.



## Vacuum bagging for a better finish

You may remember our headline story from the last newsletter introduced our new boat build, the Mcc 16. She is now out of the shed and looking great. Most of her hull and interior is built from the highest grade marine plywood. But we have also used a lovely, (re-claimed), dark African hardwood called sapele to finish her gunwales, and oak for her seats and supports. Her interior has also been fitted with buoyancy tanks to make her extra safe and stable. Her finished hull is so smart partly because of the finishing system we used. Under the guidance and technical advice of the team at Wessex Resins, we employed the latest techniques in fibreglass application to seal, protect and finish her hull to an excellent standard. This involves applying the materials, then creating a vacuum around the hull to flatten the surface by evenly spreading the epoxy resin around the surface. This is the technique used in the most modern composite builds and something our students will benefit from understanding at this stage of their learning. Much of the build has used traditional tools and methods. But we felt it would add an extra level of learning to understand and experience the latest in modern boatbuilding. When any of our older students choose a career in the marine industry, they will now be one step ahead of the curve.


